HELLO ALL,

Isn't it great when things go the way you think they should. The field trip to Mt Coot-tha Botanical Gardens on Saturday 30th March went off brilliantly. An excellent roll up benefited from a very well conducted session by Dianne Osborne.

Everyone embraced the challenge to use their camera creatively and we all learnt from the experience, thanks to Dianne's tutoring on camera settings and the process of conceiving the image you want to capture. My thanks to Dianne for sharing her knowledge so willingly and conscientiously, for taking the time to prepare and distribute a paper, "Make Art Using your Camera" before the event and for taking the time to ensure everyone present understood her message. My thanks also to Priscilla Gibbs for organising the fieldtrip.

If you have any ideas or suggestions for future fieldtrips please talk to me or a Committee member.

Perhaps because every second meeting involves judging of images and at both the Digital Group and Monochrome Group meetings image critiquing is a regular activity it is not hard to form the opinion the club is about competition. This, of course, is not the primary purpose of the club and I expect no one would say they joined because of competition. For me, and I guess it is the same for most, joining the club was motivated by the desire to improve my photography and I believed by being in a community of photographers I had a better chance of achieving that more readily through learning from others. Saturday's field trip was an excellent example of just that.

In the last newsletter I asked for members' opinions into discussions committee is having on possible changes to the Annual Competition. I am pleased to say some input has been received and well considered by your committee. At the April meeting (on the first, hope that is not an omen) committee formulated a proposal to upgrade the competition and give it greater significance by changing how it is announced. This includes changes to the Christmas Party which has seen dwindling numbers in recent years. The plan is to move our Christmas celebration to the regular first meeting night in December. The night will become the POTY (Photo of the Year) awards night and Christmas Supper. The structure of the renamed competition will see two divisions – A and Non A grade – with two sections print and digital image both of which have two categories, open colour and open monochrome. From the four winning prints the champion print of the year will be selected. Similarly the champion digital image of the year will also be awarded.

Full details are elsewhere in this newsletter. Committee is charged with the responsibility of managing the club and could implement the changes however when changing something that has been in place for some time, traditional even, I feel that floating the proposal before implementation is wise. If you have any thoughts on the proposal please share them with me or a committee member.

For me the situation has not changed from the last message, most of my time is spent thinking about, and working on, preparations for the PSQ Convention. There is news elsewhere, suffice for me to remind you of two things:

- Take advantage of the opportunity to attend a convention when it is so close to home. It can't get any closer and the program is looking great. The inspiration derived from listening to professional speakers, absorbing their imagery and being in the company of so many photographers cannot be overstated.
- We are getting close to the time when individual small tasks to help the convention to run smoothly will be identified. If at all possible please volunteer when the opportunity presents. It is our club running the show and I dearly want to do it well.



A team of nine has been preparing since mid last year for the convention. A little help from you will be greatly appreciated. Also four members – Dianne Osborne, Warren Veivers, John Doody and Sue Gordon – will be presenting in the slot set aside for the club.

Would you like to see an image of yours exhibited in a public space? The opportunity is here. Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find information on an exhibition we are holding at Mt Gravatt Library in June. I would like to see as many club members as possible represented on the library walls. If you have one or more prints that have done well in club competition please nominate them. Also if you have digital images you like and are prepared to print if selected nominate them as well. John Doody is curating the exhibition. He is accepting images in digital form for the selection process; get yours to him by April 18th. At club meetings is easiest.

Another matter on committees mind concerns are some of the club rules. Our current rule says all payments over \$20 must be made by cheque. The current model rules nominate \$100 and committee is considering changing our rule to comply. We also have a rule that limits the tenure of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to two years. I believe limiting the tenure for the latter three is disruptive to the running of the club and spoke about this at last year's AGM. Restricting the President to two years is a common occurrence which I have no qualms with. If you have an opinion on these subjects please talk to me or a committee member.

As always, enjoy your photography and keep looking for those winning images.

Annual Competition - Proposed Changes

Participation in the Annual Competition has been disappointingly low in recent years. Reasons for this are not clearly obvious, lack of promoted prestige plus B and AB graders being reticent because they are competing with A & A Gold, are possible reasons. Committee has discussed changes at its March and April meetings and resolved changes should be made to make the competition more attractive to all members with the objective of increasing the status of, and participation in, the competition.

Committee proposes the principles to be used in redefining the competition be:

- 1. The competition be renamed the Photo of the Year (POTY) competition
- Eligible entries must have been taken within the last 12 months from entry date gives a full 12 months. This gives 'of the year' significance.
- 3. There be A grade (A & A Gold) and Non A Grade (B & AB) competitions
- 4. The competition include:
 - Print Open Colour
 - Print Open Monochrome
 - PDI Open Colour
 - PDI Open Monochrome
- 5. First, second, third and HC (at the judge's discretion) be awarded in each section
- From the four winning print sections the Champion Print of the Year will be selected. Similarly a Champion Digital Image of the Year will also be awarded.
- 7. Club points be allocated as follows
 - Champion 30 Points
 - First 20 points this was set at last year's AGM
 - Second 15 points
 - Third 10 points
 - HC 5 points
- 8. Awards be:
 - Perpetual Trophy to winner of each Champion image (this means 2 new trophies) and smaller to keep trophy.
 - · Gold, Silver, Bronze medals to First, Second, Third in each section (24 medals)
 - Certificate to all winners including Highly Commended.

Committee also proposes the winners announced and awards presented at the December club meeting which will become the Photo of the Year and Christmas Supper meeting.

Lighting Subgroup – Monday 15th April 2019



WHAT IS THE ONE THING ALL PHOTOGRAPHERS USE IN COMMON? IS IT A CAMERA? IS IT A LENS? HOW ABOUT AN EDITING SUITE? ABOVE ALL IT IS LIGHT.

Many photographers only use natural light for their image making. This can limit their image making to usually only shooting during the day until this natural light fades and their exposure times become too long for the image they want.

What about still life, celebrations indoors, birthdays and parties and those projects you would like to undertake but find the lighting daunting? How do we overcome these obstacles? The answer is SUPPLEMENTARY LIGHTING.

This can consist of On/Off Camera Flash, Studio Flash and Continuous Lighting with the use of soft boxes, umbrellas, diffusers, reflectors -both positive and negative, transceivers and receivers etcetera.

The aim of the Lighting Subgroup is to help demystify these terms and how best to use these tools to light your project. The group will attempt to be as hands-on as possible so that you will have practical experience to aid your learning. We will also experiment with bounce flash using the wall or ceiling and what the limitations are.

Mount Gravatt Photographic society Photographic Exhibition Mt Gravatt Library June 2019

The club has organised to have an Exhibition at the Mt Gravatt Library in June this year.

All members are invited to submit images to be considered for inclusion in the exhibition. Our objective is to have images of a high quality so the exhibition reflects well on the club however we aim to represent as many club members in the exhibition as possible.

The Library's exhibition space has room for 25-30 images.

The club will not be printing or mounting the photos. Any images selected for display must be printed and mounted by the owner.

The club will prepare the images for display.

To streamline the selection process digital images are to be submitted to John Doody who will coordinate a selection panel to choose the images for exhibition.

Time line:

- Digital image submission ends on 18th April
- Members advised of selected images by end of April
- Selected mounted photographs will be collected at the club meetings on the 8th and the 22nd of May. (Or may be delivered to John Doody by that date)

Digital Images

- Submitted digital images to be maximum size 1400 x 1050 pixels (standard club digital submission size).
- Images may be portrait or landscape.
- Files must be named as follows: surname_initial_image title. For example for member John Smith submitting an image titled Brisbane Sunset the file should be named as follows: Smith_J_Brisbane Sunset
- Images to be submitted on a data stick which has your name, phone number and email address attached.

Mounted Prints

- Maximum size of the mounted photographs (including the mount) is 500 x 400 mm.
- The minimum overall size is A4.
- The mounting must be rigid so that the photo can be hung satisfactorily as is, that is it
 will not bend. Best to use Foamcore or rigid cardboard backing. There must be no
 tape on the back of the mount. The photos will not be framed.
- You must put your name, phone number and image title and email address on the back of the mount.

Professor Des Crawley



Des Crawley is a photographer who brings to his practice the insights derived from his role as a scholar - academic - educator - arts researcher - mentor. He was formerly Professor and Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at UWS. He taught within the Centre for Digital Media at that university prior to his retirement in 2001. He has a national, and international reputation as a photographer with a long history of consultancy work with industrial and commercial entities locally and overseas. He has conducted more than 500 workshops to amateur and professional organisations during the last decade. Exhibitions of his work have been conducted in Darwin, Sydney, Brisbane and Hobart, whilst overseas exhibitions have included shows in New York, Arles, Hull and Shenzhen in the Republic of China.

In 2017 he designed and developed a four-month long program on "Creativity". Conducted on successive weekends, it attracted some 100 participants.

Professor Crawley will open the Convention with the Keynote presentation - "Visual Cultures and The Imagined Vision" and close it with another presentation titled "Developing Creativity at Club Level - The Portfolio Process." www.descrawley.com.au

Powerful imagery makes you feel something: elated, depressed, uplifted, in despair, makes you shed a tear or remember the good times past. My passions, concerns, emotions all play a part in producing a final image. This can often result in my work varying wildly from the given scene." Adam is the lead Sunday morning speaker with a presentation titled "The Search for Meaningful Photography." He is also conducting a workshop on Sunday afternoon - "Creative Photoshop Wizardry". Re-usable Matboard Frame for competition print entries

HOW TO MAKE A RE-USABLE FRAME FOR YOUR PRINT ENTRIES FOR MONTHLY CLUB COMPETITIONS:

You'll need a backing board and matboard frame of matching size, some packaging tape and/or cloth tape and some 'Micropore' which is available from chemists or Priceline stores.



STEP 1

Line up the edges of your matboard and frame and hinge them with either a strip of packaging or cloth tape down one side on what will become the inside of the frame.



STEP 2

Create a frame of packaging tape on the backing board as shown in the photos. Your print can then be attached to either the packaging tape or the back of the cardboard frame using Micropore. Or attach your photo directly to the front the matboard if you prefer.



STEP 3

Make some loops of Micropore to seal the frame shut at each corner.

This makes the board easily re-usable as the Micropore pulls away without damaging either the matboard or your photo.

As all the tape is contained within the inside of the frame, it also means that YOUR FRAME CAN'T DAMAGE ANYONE ELSE'S PRINTS.

When submitting your entries, please ensure that there is **NO** tape on any external edge of the frame. We have had some entries damaged by tape from other people's frames. **Your entries may be rejected if this occurs**.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF ACCEPTANCE LIST

Approvals: Acceptances in an Australian National Exhibition approved by APS are claimable for LAPS and AAPS. Acceptances in an International Exhibition approved by APS, FIAP, RPS, PSNZ, UPI or a Section of the Exhibition approved by PSA are claimable for LAPS, AAPS and FAPS.

LAPS: 50 acceptances are required including 10 acceptances from National or APS Approved International Australian exhibitions. No more than 15 acceptances can be claimed from any one country other than Australia which is unlimited. No awards are required.

AAPS: 100 acceptances are required including 20 acceptances from National or APS Approved International Australian exhibitions and may include those gained for LAPS. No more than 25 acceptances can be claimed from any one country other than Australia which is unlimited. 20 titles must have 2 or more acceptances. 5 different images must receive awards. No more than 2 awards are claimable from any one country other than Australia which is unlimited.

FAPS: 200 acceptances are required, all from International Exhibitions including 10 acceptances from APS Approved International Australian exhibitions and may include the acceptances gained in International Exhibitions for LAPS or AAPS. No more than 25 acceptances can be claimed from any one country other than Australia which is unlimited. 40 titles must have 2 or more acceptances. 10 different images must receive awards from 5 different countries.

Titles: List the titles of the claimable acceptances for the Honour currently being sought including those previously used for LAPS and/or AAPS if claimable. Do not list more than 20 additional acceptances beyond the requirement for the Honour currently being sought, ie. list a maximum of 70 acceptances for LAPS; 120 acceptances for AAPS; or 220 acceptances for FAPS.

Each acceptance must be completed in full and detailed on one line only. Do not leave blank lines between acceptances.

List all acceptances by their Original Title followed by their Other Title where applicable-ie. Original Title : Other Title.

Exhibition: The Exhibition name may be abbreviated, eg. 'Sydney International' for the 'Sydney International Exhibition of Photography'.

Year: List the Year of the Exhibition by the closing date of the Exhibition, eg. 2013.

Country: List the Country conducting the Exhibition, eg. Australia. For a Circuit which includes more than one country, specify the country which is conducting the Exhibition within the Circuit. For Circuits or Exhibitions in the United Kingdom, specify the country as England, Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland according to where the Exhibition is being conducted-these locations will be accepted as separate countries for the country limit.

Approval: List one form of Approval for the exhibition, eg. APS 2014/01; FIAP 2014/002; PSA ND, etc.

Awards: Awards are defined as 1st, 2nd, and 3rd placings, Trophies, Medals, Diplomas, Judge's Choice, Honourable Mentions, Certificates of Merit, or Highly Commended. List any Award obtained for the acceptance, eg. APS Gold Medal.

Country Acceptance No.: For each country, number each acceptance in the same country with a consecutive number noting the minimum number of Australian acceptances required and the other country limits applicable to each Honour set out above.

Do not claim acceptances exceeding the country limits.

Claimable Award: If the Award is claimable for the Honour being sought indicate Y for Yes. If it is not claimable because it exceeds the country limit on Awards indicate N for No.

Multiple Title No.: Each title which receives a second acceptance becomes a 'Multiple Title' set. Number the first 2 acceptances of each Multiple Title set with a consecutive Multiple Title No., eg. the first and second acceptances of title 'Blue' are numbered '1'; the first and second acceptances of title 'Red' are numbered '2'; the first and second acceptances of title 'Yellow' are numbered '3', etc. You must have 20 Multiple Titles sets for AAPS and 40 Multiple Title sets for FAPS.

Catalogue Type: Specify the type of catalogue, P for a printed catalogue; CD for a CD or DVD catalogue; or W for a web (online) catalogue.

VO: This column is for the Verifying Officer's initials. The VO and the applicant must also sign the front page of the application.
